



## Walk 5 Arthur's Meadows and Bier Lane

**This three mile walk takes you through the fields and lovely meadows of Fen Street Farm to the north of Redgrave and back up the Bier Lane cart track to the church. You return along the track past the Ice House onto Half Moon Lane and into Redgrave from the east.**

3 miles. We measure our walks and then give a time based on a walking speed of two and a half miles per hour. This is a realistic speed with time to see the view and chat. So an hour and a quarter.

**a** Turn left out of the pub. Walk along the road until you turn left **b** up a footpath on the left, (just as the recreation ground starts on the right).

**c** At the top of the hill a track to the right takes you across the field. You can see the church ahead. This track turns sharp left **d** and then right when you get to the trees which you keep to your left **e** and walk down to the lone tree. **f** Left here and along the hedge, then across a field and through the hedge **g** into the first of two hay meadows. Pass the farm on your left and through the second meadow **h** with its wartime hut and through the hedge at the end of the meadow. Over a little wooden bridge onto the Bier Lane.

**i** Turn right, up the Bier Lane towards the Church.

The lane takes you between two ponds, up to the top of the hill where there is a double bend

and then up to the road a little to the east of the church.

**j** Turn right on the road and leave it opposite the church at the start of the track to Hall Farm. **k** The footpath takes you behind the little wood, over a small bridge and then **l** left along the hedge. Follow the track until it reaches the cart track **m** from the farm to the village. At the end of the field to your left the track continues straight with woods on the left. In these woods you can see The Ice House of the Old Redgrave Hall. This track takes you back into the village past Tanglewood on your left **n** and then onto Half Moon Lane. When you meet the road, turn right past All Saints Church, (with the blue cross in its window) over The Green to The Cross Keys.
